

I'm writing the Newsletter at the end of April just after the funeral of the Duke of Edinburgh, which I imagine lots of you watched on your TV's I think the most moving picture that remains with me was the picture of the Queen sat by herself during the service.

"God has not forgotten you"

In your darkest moments maybe you have been tempted to think that God has forgotten you but as Christians we know that God is





But actually sensing God's presence and comfort is different. It give joy when you are discouraged (Ps 16:11) it refreshes you when you are weary (Acts 3:20) and sensing God's presence and comfort takes away fear when we are feeling overwhelmed by life.

In Psalm 23 David begins by talking about God and His tender care, saying,"the Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want" But when he is in danger and suffering, he shifts from talking about God to talking directly to Him.

He says "Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me (Ps 23:4)

There is a nearness, a personal-ness to God that David immediately feels when in trouble.

The incomparable presence of God in our pain underscores that a day with Him in trial is better than a thousand pain-free days elsewhere.

Even though the Queen sat alone she was not alone, she has a bright faith in God that has carried her through life and God will continue to do so. I'm impressed that every Christmas during the Queen's speak she always makes mention of Jesus the saviour and encourages people to put their trust in Him.

Which is more than could be said for the religious professorial who led the Dukes funeral service, without an ounce of passion and not much compassion.

If you are struggling today, remember God has not forgotten you. He has engraved you on the palms of His hands (Isaiah 49: 15-16) He will never fail you or forsake you. He will walk with you through every dark valley.

The God who has numbered every hair on your head and knows every sparrow that falls to the ground is aware of every detail of your situation. He is using your suffering and pain in ways you would not believe if someone told you. And after you have suffered a little while, the God of all grace, who has called you to His eternal glory in Christ, will Himself restore, confirm, strengthen, and establish you. (1 Peter 5:10)

We are going to advertise the series around our local





If we're in a big hurry, mirror-time may be a mere glance, but getting dressed is not optional. Oh, that this single verse would become just as daily of a rhythm for us.


